<b>Description:</b>	<a href="#">This project aims to validate a Gamulation intervention to enhance diabetes knowledge and management skills among underserved populations with type 2 diabetes. The project will be conducted at the <i>Health For All</i> free clinic in Bryan TX which serves an uninsured population specifically. Students who work on this project will interact with the healthcare team at clinical, experience first hand how social determinants of health impact health outcomes (such as language and cultural barriers, financial disadvantage, social insecurity, and low health literacy), and identify potential solutions that could mitigate existing health disparities. Students will also have the opportunity to assist with implementing and evaluating the intervention.</a>
<b>Evaluation Format:</b>	<a href="#">How will the student be evaluated? The SON faculty member and the practicum student will meet at least once per week every week to review assignments and results produced by the student. The student will be responsible for setting up regular meetings with the SON practicum supervisor. The student will provide a summary of progress, along with questions the student would like to discuss with the instructor. The meetings will be held in person unless the instructor requests they be held via ZOOM.</a>
<b>Expectations:</b>	What is the student expected to do? <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Student will comply with all applicable SPH practicum policies and guidelines found at <a href="https://public-health.tamu.edu/practice/practicum.html">https://public-health.tamu.edu/practice/practicum.html</a> and communicate regularly with faculty member</li> <li>2. The students will identify Public Health Competencies that translate into practice.</li> <li>3. The student will assist in conducting evidence-based intervention to enhance patients' health. During this process, the student will learn quantitative and qualitative data collection methods, apply awareness of cultural values and practices to patient care, communicate audience-appropriate public health content, both in writing and through oral presentations, and interact with interprofessional healthcare teams.</li> <li>4. The student will be expected to produce a presentation of the outcomes/findings/analysis conducted during the practicum experience.</li> </ol>
