


# **Aggie Student-Centered Express Nursing Degree (ASCEND)**







#### **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

- This RN-to-BSN program is exclusively for Blinn College nursing students.
- Complete an Associate of Applied Science in Nursing degree from Blinn and Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree from Texas A&M University while co-enrolled in both institutions.
- Take ADN courses in person at Blinn and BSN courses completely online through Texas A&M.

# **APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS**

- NursingCAS and Apply Texas applications and fees
- Enrolled and attending first or second semester in the Blinn ADN Program with verification of good standing
- Official college transcripts from each institution attended sent to NursingCAS
- Professional references/letters of recommendations not accepted

# \*Nursing science course

Students applying from other Texas public institutions may take up to three hours of math which meet that institution's core curriculum requirements. Out-of-state or private university applicants must have three hours of math from the Texas A&M Core Curriculum.

Foreign language proficiency required. This can be met by taking two years of same language in high school, two semesters of college credit or proficiency by exam.
