### **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

- Equips advanced practice registered nurses for roles as practice-oriented scientists skilled in the translation of evidence into clinical practice, measurement of patient outcomes and transformation of health care systems to ensure quality and safety
- Prepares graduates for practice-based leadership and combats the shortage of advanced practice providers
- Builds upon the experiences and education of professional nurses to analyze and evaluate the quality, safety, effectiveness and efficiency of patient care and systems of care
- Clinical doctoral degree offering experience in leading high-performing interprofessional teams to co-create solutions that promote positive health outcomes and health care delivery
- \$375,000 in scholarships available annually through Texas A&M Health Rural Engagement Program

## **Application Requirements**

- Graduate degree in nursing from a CCNE or NLNAC nationally accredited nursing program
- Advanced pharmacology, physical assessment and pathophysiology with a minimum grade of "B"
- Unencumbered RN license to practice in the state of Texas
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on 4.0 scale) in all graduate course work
- Completion of elementary statistics course with a grade minimum grade of "B"
- NursingCAS application and fee
- Statement of purpose relating to the applicant's practice interest, career goals and desire to pursue doctoral education
- Curriculum vitae or professional resume
- Three letters of reference
- Verification of practice hours
- Timed verbal and written assessments
- Applicants with foreign credentials please refer to website for further application requirements
- Students must reside in Texas during the program


