- Course instruction delivered asynchronously online

Application Requirements

- Bachelor of Science in Nursing and unencumbered RN license
- Recommended cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on 4.0 scale) in all undergraduate course work
- Elementary statistics course with minimum grade of "C"
- NursingCAS application and fee
- Official college transcripts
- Professional resume
- Three professional references
- Online interview and online written assessments through the secondary assessment provider, Kira Talent
- Applicants with foreign credentials please refer to website for further application requirements

Application Alert

- Due to higher education regulations, the Texas A&M College of Nursing is unable to accept applications for the MSN-Nursing Education program from students residing in specific states.
- Relocation to another state may prevent students from completing practicum courses due to nursing board regulations.

Practicum & Preceptors

- Preceptors required for the teaching and advanced clinical practicum courses
- Students must secure preceptors for practicum experiences
- Complete 225 clinical hours
- Contractual agreement between the preceptor's clinical site/agency and Texas A&M required
