APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Associate degree in nursing from a regionally accredited college required prior to entry
- Applicants who completed ADN through bridge program must have earned a minimum of 30 transferable credits in their program
- Current, unencumbered RN license
- Prerequisite coursework completed prior to entry
- NursingCAS and Apply Texas application and fee
- Professional resume and one professional or academic reference evaluation
- Official college transcripts
- Some applicants will complete the online interview and online written assessments through the secondary assessment provider, Kira Talent
- Additional requirements listed online for applicants with foreign credentials
