# Second-Degree Bachelor of Science in Nursing



#### **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

- Accelerated BSN degree program with 61 semester credit hours in upper-level nursing coursework completed in only four semesters (15 months)
- Offered at Round Rock campus
- Previous bachelor's degree in another field of study required
- Requires completion of core curriculum and prerequisite nursing courses before entry (if not already complete in first degree)
- Faculty to student ratio of 1:8
- Annual Disaster Day student-led event offers interdisciplinary, simulated experience

- NursingCAS and Apply Texas applications and fees
- Official college transcripts from each institution attended sent to NursingCAS
- HESI Admissions Assessment exam scores
- Completion of all prerequisite courses with a minimum grade of "C" by the first class day
- Online verbal and written assessments through our secondary assessment provider, Kira Talent
- International applicant credentials (if applicable)
- Professional references/letters of recommendations not accepted
