- HESI Admissions Assessment exam scores
- Completion of all prerequisite courses with a minimum grade of "C" by the first class day
- Online verbal and written assessments through our secondary assessment provider, Kira Talent
- International applicant credentials (if applicable)
- Professional references/letters of recommendations not accepted
